CHINA REACTS TO UN SECURITY COUNCIL DECISION

Recently, the Middle East has exploded in a mass of uprisings against their long-time dictators. This wave of rebellion started off in Egypt, where massive protests, marches, and strikes forced the president of twentynine years, Hosni Mubarak, to step down from power. This successful transition to democracy in Egypt sparked similar popular uprisings in neighboring countries, especially in Libya, where civilians are currently trying to unseat their powerful and often eccentric president, Moammar Gadhafi.

As of now, the U.N. Security Council has agreed to send in air-strike forces in order to establish a no-fly air zone to protect civilians from government troops.

However, there have been reports that the air strikes are causing civilian casualties, and China is increasingly urging the UN to call a cease-fire and stop all fighting. Chinese media has also been criticizing the U.S. and the Western powers for interfering in other nations' business and increasing the violence in Libya. "China supports the continued diplomatic efforts of the UN Secretary General's Special Envoy to Libya, the African Union and the Arab League for peaceful settlement of the current crisis in Libya," said Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Jiang Yu. Whether or not China will take action to support their position still remains in question.




